



EN4: Environmental Policy

Age Concern Liverpool & Sefton is a registered charity, number 517902, that “promotes and assists the general good of all older people in any geographical area but with a particular focus on North Merseyside meaning Liverpool, Sefton and all areas north of the River Mersey, by making gifts of sums of money and goods to such older people, providing facilities for physical and mental recreation, developing physical improvement, furthering health, relieving poverty, distress or sickness or pursuing any objects which now or hereafter may be deemed by law to be charitable and to assist the work of statutory authorities and voluntary organisations engaged in pursuing the objects of the Association.

To promote and organise co-operation in the achievement of the objects of the Association and to that end, to bring together representatives of the authorities and organisations engaged in the furtherance of the objects of the Association wherever they may operate but with particular focus on North Merseyside”.



- Where practicable will use environmentally safe and sustainable energy sources to meet its needs.
- Will seek to address its impact on the environment through the adoption of a sustainable procurement policy and conserve resources through efficient use and careful planning.
- Will continually improve overall environmental performance by setting a series of objectives and performance targets as part of a formal management programme
- Maintains that a primary part of its corporate environmental strategy is sustainable waste management and as such recognises its responsibilities to recycle materials wherever possible through safe and responsible methods.
- Will work with its suppliers to ensure they recognise and reduce the environmental impact of their products and transportation and measured by periodic review of suppliers' environmental policy and impact assessments.
- Through coordinating route planning, seeks to realise the dual benefits of reduced fuel consumption and lower exhaust emissions.
